





TIPS FOR TBFFC – No. 30

Casting Tip for TBFFC: 13


When casting, why do I sometime hear a "crack" when starting my forward cast?


This is a common casting fault that can be accompanied by frayed leaders or flies that lose most of their dressing. If you begin the forward cast too early and too fast this will happen. The forward part of the cast should begin as the line is almost completely unrolled, **this does not include the leader**. It should look like a candy cane. Begin all casts slowly increasing speed to a final stop. As with other casting problems, slow everything down, always trying to make a technically acceptable cast.

This year, the scoring was changed to make each casting station have an equal weighting of 100 points. In addition, the 4th target at the accuracy station had to be hit with the contestant using a backcast, or casting with his/her "wrong" hand. The winners are highlighted in yellow on the table below, which is arranged in order of team scores. Trophies were not available at the time of the shootout, but will be engraved and presented at a later date.

- 1. The overall winner was Nick Angelo, with a score of 525 out of a possible 600 points.
- 2. The highest scoring team was "Skinny", with Greg Peterson, Dave Chouinard, and Chris Homer.
- 3. The winner of the longest cast during the afternoon shootout was **Dave Olsen**, who was the defending champion.

How to win the Carl Hanson Outing by Jeff Janecek



ľve always to try wanted Frank Sergeants Park. Ken's (Ken Hofmeister) big catch numbers every year were hard to ignore. How could I fish hard for 4 hrs and get 10 fish and this man in the 80's?

I found it to be a completely different fishery with clear, shallow water, low branches, and shady nooks. The river is very narrow here. Perfect for a 3wt Temple Fork with Rio grooved flyline. The grooves make for a slick casting surface; with no cleaning till the end of the day. The rod loads up with one back cast and a 15' cast is very accurately placed. 11 fish were caught in the tight canal leading to the river. Once it opened, I found fish schooling in front of every tree; the shallower the better. I could catch 8 to 10 and move on 15'. I used a #8 chartreuse grasshopper with an 11' leader and 6lb tippet. A hard splat on the water and one tug of the line was all that was needed. A very deliberate steady lift of the rod would set the small sharp hook the best. I averaged 34 fish per hour. This figured could have been much higher if all the strikes connected. Four bass were caught...just by landing next to them. I didn't retrieve the fly back. The largest was 11 inches. Many larger bass were around busting glass minnows, but my goal was to get high numbers, so a popper was not tied on. I had a slack between 9:30 and 10:00. Then heading down river produced a fish on every cast again. I know 138 fish is hard to swallow, but give this area a try and you will be convinced when you get back to the boat ramp. 🦰

Editor's Note: Jeff won the Carl Hanson trophy for the most fish caught with a record 138 count. He also tied with **Walt Durkin** for the biggest fish caught (an 11-inch bass), and will share the new "big fish" trophy, a framed print of Carl Hanson. Unfortunately, there was no available photo of Walt holding this print at the time of publication.

FLY OF THE MONTH

Brad Lowman Mullet Fly As Tied by Brad Lowman



Materials:

Hook: Tiemco sp600 #1 Tail: White saddle hackles Body: Steve Farrar Blend white/olive Flash: Gliss-n-glow pearl (mop) Thread: Mono and fluorescent orange Eyes: 3/8" large pupil

Tying instructions:

- 1. Tie on 4 saddle hackles, 2 each side.
- 2. Add body, hi-tie style, white for belly and olive for top.
- 3. Add a few strands of gliss-n-glow to form a halo around the fly.
- 4. Trim to desired shape.
- 5. Attach eyes.
- 6. Cover eyes with Aleens Super Fabric Glue



Fishing Report and Forecast "What a great time to go fishing!"

Capt. Byron Chamberlin and **Capt Nick Angelo** were entered in the RedFly Tournament and caught several nice trout, one measuring close to 26 inches. They caught the trout while targeting redfish. They did also catch 30 redfish; most were small rats but they did catch about 6 in the 20 to 24.75 inch range. Capt. Byron reports that due to the water temp dropping to what it should be for this time that fishing is pretty good.

The MCFF/CCA all fly tournament was fished on Saturday, November 6 in 20 to 25 MPH winds and 40- 60 degree temps. out of Thompson Park in Sarasota. **Capt. John Hand** guided **Dusty Sprague** to 1st place in the open division. **Robert Fischer** fished with **Tom Cawthon** and they took 1st and second place in the amateur division. *See article elsewhere in this newsletter*.

David Mullins ventured to Picnic Island right after the cold front to test some new fly patterns he just learned to tie. The ladyfish loved all colors except the copper/brown pattern. He caught about three dozen. Later in the day Dave met another fly fisherman and exchanged views on why they were out in cold weather and winds up to 20 knots. Dave's reply was that it was good practice.

Capt. Rick Grassett reports that fishing in Sarasota Bay has been very good. Anglers fishing with him caught a variety of fish including trout, blues, redfish and pompano.

Jeff Janecek won the Carl Hanson outing trophy for most fish caught with an amazing 138. He also shared biggest fish honors with **Walt Durkin**. Each caught a bass measuring eleven inches. Jeff and friend Rick went back to the Hillsborough River and caught about 60 more.


